



WORKSHOPS

3D Art



3d Street Art is a type of artwork painted or drawn in a specific way that creates an optical illusion that tricks the mind into believing that the 2d artwork they are reviewing is actually three-dimensional. Learn to paint and create an illusion.

Balloon Art



Balloon sculpting or balloon twisting is taking a long balloon and twist it into a balloon sculpture. Learn two primary design styles "single balloon modelling", which restricts itself to the use of one balloon per model, and "multiple balloon modelling" using more than one balloon.



Cartooning

Enjoy drawing cartoons for work and play. Learn to develop your drawing techniques, decide on art materials, and prepare your artistic understanding as a cartoonist.



Clowning

This acting/performance workshop uses games and improvisation exercises. Games enhance deep-listening and your connection with your scene partner and the audience.



Dance T

It is a fusion style of dance, adapting western, folk, Bollywood and various other dances, imbued with elements of Indian classical, folk, and tribal dance, which is set to a fast pace and music to move your body and enjoy the rhythm.





Face painting is in fact a unique art form, and the artists use faces as their canvas and transform them into animals or fantasy characters.





Magic

Magic workshop helps a child to think beyond his/her imagination and enhances creativity. Since most of the Magic tricks are based on science, this helps the child to understand Magic while studying.



Paper Craft

Learn a collection of crafts using paper or card as the primary artistic medium for the creation of two or threedimensional objects.





Papiermache



Paper mâché is a classic art technique that all children should experience at some point in their childhood. Getting your hands covered in ooey, gooey paste is a rite of passage! You will be taught some preparation and planning.

Pattachitra



One of the oldest and most popular art forms of Odisha, Pattachitra is a painting done on canvas, and is manifested by rich colourful application, creative motifs and designs.

Pottery



A wheel-building pottery workshop is an engaging space where you can delve into the world of pottery creation using manual techniques. Guided by experts, create your own clay toys and sculpture.



Rag Doll

Create your very own rag doll using fabric, hand spun yarn, and wool. In this workshop you will learn to make traditional rag doll from start to finish using your hands.



Regional Museum of Natural History will organise a 3 days workshop on various organic crafts. Workshop provides creativity inspired by the beauty of the natural world!



RSC

Regional Science Center will organise a 3 days science is fun workshop. Science workshops stimulate children's curiosity and interest in the world around them. They help them discover the wonder and excitement of science, which can foster a long-term interest in scientific learning.





Carve a sand sculpture, with renowned sand artists of Odisha, with clean and fine grained sand mixed with water. A huge sandpit in the camp will attract all.



Story Telling with Puppets

Puppets encourage kids to use their imagination and infuse a sense of play into storytime. This is an exploration into making your puppets and bringing stories into our bodies, into the space and alive through puppets.



Theatre

Theatre helps in moulding a well rounded personality. Learn to communicate the who, what, where, when, and why to the audience. Improvisation fosters quick-thinking solutions, which leads to greater adaptability in life.

DISABILITY

To create an understanding of the issue, the impact of an inclusive society and development, to allay all fears – Swabhiman has conceptualised "Dialogues in Disability." The dialogues take many forms – seminars, panel discussions, radio talks, TV discussions, workshop, group discussion etc.

CULTURAL PROGRAMS

The audience witnesses a riveting presentation of songs, dances and plays in the evenings. Elements like magic shows, game zone, star gazing, meeting celebrities, funny games, cartoons etc. are added every year.





CITY EMBRACES ANJALI

In a bid to sensitize the whole city about the Anjali festival and create a "City Festival," Individuals and organizations are encouraged to invite some teams to their clubs, premises and homes. The main objective is creating City's Ownership of Anjali and encouraging all to accept differences, celebrate diversity and create an inclusive planet.

CITY TOUR

One of the integral components of joyful learning is trips and tours that are both educative and entertaining. This year trips will be conducted to Nandan Kanan, Odisha Maritime Museum, Dhaulagiri, Khandagiri, Udayagiri, Planetarium and Kala Bhoomi.

Students from local art colleges are challenged to develop art works based on the theme of the year and are sensitized to disability in the process of volunteering.


